

Stop Deceptive Advertising and Federal Funding of Fake Women's Health Clinics!

Dear Congressional Leaders,

Crisis Pregnancy Centers (CPCs) deceptively advertise as comprehensive women's health clinics, often listed under "abortion services," to lure women to their facilities, where they are pressured to choose pregnancy or adoption in lieu of abortion or birth control. Of the 3,500 CPCs nationwide, a Congressional study found that 87% provide false and misleading information about birth control and abortion. The American Medical Association, American Psychological Association, and the World Health Organization all dispell fake clinics' false claims that abortion leads to breast cancer, infertility, suicide, and that condoms are ineffective. The Hatch Amendment, which reinstates \$250 million in federal funding, over 5 years, for failed abstinence-only Title V programs, slipped under the radar and made its way into the new Health Care Reform Bill. States can choose to opt into this funding and millions of these federal dollars will be funneled to fake clinics. **We urge you to support legislation that would stop CPCs' deceptive advertising practices, require that accurate medical information is provided, and eliminate ALL federal funding for CPCs!**
