

What good is a “morning after” pill if it takes three days to get it.



It's safer than aspirin and 95% effective, if taken within 24 hours of unprotected sex. By preventing fertilization or implantation, emergency contraception can help prevent the need for 800,000 abortions a year. But current FDA rules that require a prescription are keeping women from accessing this important pill. Only 1 out of 3 women who are sexually assaulted are given emergency contraceptives (E.C.). And some pharmacists have even refused to fill prescriptions. You can help by demanding that emergency contraception be made available over the counter today.

Over-the-counter **EC** is long overdue.
